1 Corinthians 3:16

Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

Yet some single men and women treat church more like a meat market, rather than church. They go with the mindset of, *"I need to find me a woman"* or *"I need to find me a man"*.

Or there are those in church who spend time gossiping or saying bad things about other Christian brothers or sisters?

Some judge another Christian brothers or sisters based upon what they see, or even worse, what they have heard others say about him or her?

How many will not help a Christian brother or sister because they don't like or even care about them at all?

With these things in mind, when we look at our brother or sister in Christ, which is *"the temple of God"*, What are we thinking about them? What are we saying about them? How are we treating them?

Or let's put it into perspective according to today's verse, with "*the temple of God*" being other Christians.

Sine we also are *"the temple of God"*, how do we want to be treated and talked about? Now, let's go and do the same for others.

- Philippians 2:1-4 Therefore if there is any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, fulfill my joy by being like-minded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind. Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others.
- James 3:13-16 (MSG) Do you want to be counted wise, to build a reputation for wisdom? Here's what you do: Live well, live wisely, live humbly. It's the way you live, not the way you talk, that counts. Mean-spirited ambition isn't wisdom. Boasting that you are wise isn't wisdom. Twisting the truth to make yourselves sound wise isn't wisdom. It's the furthest thing from wisdom—it's animal cunning, devilish conniving. Whenever you're trying to look better than others or get the better of others, things fall apart and everyone ends up at the others' throats.
