## 1 Kings 18:16-18 (NLT)

So Obadiah went to tell Ahab that Elijah had come, and Ahab went out to meet him. "So it's you, is it--Israel's troublemaker?" Ahab asked when he saw him.

"I have made no trouble for Israel," Elijah replied. "You and your family are the troublemakers, for you have refused to obey the commands of the LORD and have worshiped the images of Baal instead."

God says,

† Heb 13:4 Marriage is honorable among all, and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge.

The results, no diseases, planned and wanted children, joy and strong family values.

So next time the world make fun of you because you are a Christian. Have compassion on them and pray for them that God will open their eye's to the lie they are living, and to be able to see the truth which is Jesus Christ.
