I agree 100% and I am just as guilty as everyone else in doing this. But is that guy kind of good looking, but he's not buffed, so you say forget it? Or is that girl just a little overweight, or she doesn't have that perfect hourglass figure so you pass on her?

Let me ask you this then. Say you find that guy who is all buffed and looks like he should be modeling men's underwear. Or you find that girl who is not a ten but a twenty in your eyes, she has all the right curves in all the right places and her hair is that perfect length that you like and the color you like, naturally.

Now let's say that you are dating or that you get married.
