I say this because I know that some of you are getting frustrated in your ministry wondering why you are doing it. And that it seems that no one really cares.

Just stop right now and ask yourself why you are doing it, for man or the Lord.

Who will reward you in the end, man or God?

Or are you looking for a reward now instead of in heaven?
