But the reason I was hit with the hail was because I had taken the protection off of the truck, and also I didn't have the glass tops made to put on it yet.

But how many times do we go on in life and start to make little subtle changes?

Maybe going to an "R" rated movie instead of a PG or G movie.

Maybe watching a bad show on TV instead of doing something good for you and your family. Maybe you pick up your cell phone or tablet instead of the bible.

Maybe you ask that guy or girl from work out to lunch, even though you are married. It could be a harmful word against someone. They did something wrong, and you knew you just had to tell someone, at least one person. What harm could that do?

Whatever it may be that you have compromised on in your Christian walk, once you do, you are leaving an opening for the devil to throw his fiery darts at us, and not just throw them but hit us where it hurts.

Just like in my younger years I thought it would be cool to cut a T-top on the roof of my truck. I never thought about the fact that I was removing my protection, until it was too late. So don't try to be cool and be like the world, because once you do, you are removing that protection of faith.
