Jeremiah 16:17

For My eyes are on all their ways; they are not hidden from My face, nor is their iniquity hidden from My eyes.

Sin, sin, it seems that is always a hot topic when it comes to being a Christian. We try to stop sinning; and we tell the lost to repent of their sins. But sin is a reality, and the bible is very clear that everyone sins, yes even your grandma and pastor is a sinner.

Promans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God

And in the original Greek, the word "all" means "all" and that's "all," "all" means. There are no exceptions because "*all have sinned*." Yet the world, and even Christians try to sugarcoat or hide sin by calling it different names. Here are a few examples.

Did you know that the word "alcoholism" is not in the bible, but the word "drunk" or "drunkard" is.

Proverbs 23:21 For the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, And drowsiness will clothe a man with rags.

In fact, the world even calls it a disease, but I never heard of wearing a mask or getting a vaccine for the prevention of getting the disease of alcoholism.

Here is another word that is not in the bible, and that word is "Abortion" But child sacrifice is.

♥ Isaiah 57:5 (NLT2) You worship your idols with great passion beneath the oaks and under every green tree. You <u>sacrifice</u> your <u>children</u> down in the valleys, among the jagged rocks in the cliffs. (underlined for emphasis)

Here is another one, the word "choice" is never used to describe an unborn baby in the bible, but the word children or child is. I say that because both the world, and Christians, seem to want to call an unborn child a choice. Really, why in the world would anyone want to call an unborn baby a choice? There is no choice other than to murder or not to murder a child. Sure decisions people make are choices, like choosing to have sex before marriage, or a planned child after you are married and the result of the choice is a child, which is not a choice after you made the choice. But to call an unborn child a choice, really? When Mary became pregnant, God gave Mary the option (choice) of getting pregnant or not (Yes she could had said no). But once Mary said yes and became pregnant, Jesus in Mary's womb was never called a choice.

Luke 2:5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with <u>child</u>. (underlined for emphasis) not with a choice.

How about watching a movie full of sex and nudity, do you realize every time you do, you are committing fornication, or adultery (if you are married) every time you do.

Matthew 5:28 But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

Do I need to go on? What about when you are angry or have hatred towards someone, didn't Jesus call that murder?

Matthew 5:21-22 You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.' But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, 'Raca!' shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire.

Ok, I think you get the idea now. But think about it, how many things have been sugarcoated by the world by calling them something other than what they are, Child Sacrifice, Murder, Adultery, Drunkard, Sorcery (Witchcraft, fortunetelling, horoscope). And the sad thing is that so many Christians will buy into these watered-down definitions of sin, and by doing so, they willfully practice them all the time, and the reason is ignorance of what scripture says, because they can't find those words in the bible. Did you know the word Trinity, Rapture, or even Bible is not in the bible?

Well, I am going to give you a little homework, and that is to read the following verses, and see what the world, and even Christians now calls them and has made them acceptable by renaming or sugarcoating them. Then once you do, ask yourself how many you have been committing because of how it was renamed or deemed acceptable by the world. An example would be "covetousness" = mine or I deserve that

Romans 1:29-31 being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, evil-mindedness; they are whisperers, backbiters, haters of God, violent, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful.
