

## **Job 2:9**

*Then his wife said to him, "Do you still hold fast to your integrity? Curse God and die!"*

Now this is a wife I wish I had, NOT!

But maybe you are a wife of someone who has been called into a ministry. Remember that a ministry is not always being a pastor, because there are several ministries talked about throughout the bible. Think of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, all of those gifts are a ministry.

**1 Cor 12:7** *But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all:*

So the question for you as a wife is, are you supporting your husband in what the Lord has called him to do, or are you putting him down, just like Job's wife was?

Maybe it's the opposite and maybe your wife has been called into a ministry, are you supporting her as well or do you act like a nagging old wife like Job's?

Or it could be that you are not married but you do know someone who has been called into a ministry, maybe your brother or sister, mom or dad, or even a good friend, how are you supporting him or her?

So why should you support them? First off because God has called them, whether you accept it or not. Should your spouse be more obedient to you then to God?

Second is that God will bless your spouse and you will also take part in those blessings.

† **Job 42:12-13** *Now the LORD blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; for he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, one thousand yoke of oxen, and one thousand female donkeys. He also had seven sons and three daughters.*

It was tough for a while for Job, and it was tough for his wife as well. But as they stayed true to the Lord and His calling, everything worked out, and it will for you as well.

† **Hebrews 10:24-25 (NLT2)** *Let us think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.*

Also remember when you encourage and pray and support others in the ministry God has given them, you get part of the reward as well.

† **1 Corinthians 3:6-9** *I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase. Now he who plants and he who waters are one, and each one will receive his own reward according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building.*
