

John 4:13-14

Jesus answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life."

Have you ever been really, really thirsty, so much so that you would go anywhere to get a cool drink of water? I remember as a kid, when working in the yard and it was hot outside, drinking water from the hose... Oh, there is nothing like tasting the cool plastic tasting water from the water hose, remember those times.

What if you were in the middle of the desert and you were dying of thirst, what would you do, just sit there and wait for the water to come to you or would you get up and search out water to quench your thirst? Obviously you would go search out water no matter how weak you felt.

What about when you are going through those dry times in your spiritual walk? Do you just sit there doing nothing, waiting for the living water to come to you. "It ain't gonna happen" No, in those dry times you need to search out living water in the word of God.

The woman at the well, the one Jesus was talking to here in today's devotional verse, came seeking the world to quench her thirst, but Jesus said to her, "*Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again*"

In those dry times spiritually, are you seeking things of this world to fill you spiritually, yet you keep walking away still feeling thirsty?

During those times, listen to what Jesus told this woman, *whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life.*

And how do you get this water to quench your spiritual thirst during those dry times?

† **John 4:10** *Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water."*

It's as simple as asking **Him**, getting up and opening up the word and drinking freely, **and He would have given you living water.**
