

Joshua 24:15

And if it seems evil to you to serve the LORD, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD.

How many of you have this portion of scripture hanging in your home or over the door outside your door?

“But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD.”

Now how many of you love it and also live it, even if it is not hanging in your home?

But I wonder how many really read it and truly understand what it is saying? How many actually read it as;

- *But as for me and my house, we will love the LORD.*
- *But as for me and my house, we will go to church for the LORD.*
- *But as for me and my house, we will tithe ten percent to the LORD.*

Although those are all things we should be doing as believers, it actually doesn't say any of those, but the one important word I think some people gloss over or ignore, is the word “*serve*”. For some of you, that may sound like fingernails on a chalkboard, because you hear all the time that you need to serve in the church or be a servant to others. But you are not, and you feel bad whenever it is mentioned in church or a devotional (like this one). For some you can barely make it to church every Sunday, let alone be there serving in the church.

“*Well, I have a job and a family and...*” you may be thinking.

Actually, what you have is excuses, because an excuse is really a sugarcoated way of saying NO to the Lord, and the saying should read more like:

- *“But as for me and my house, we can't serve the LORD, because _____.”* You fill in the blank.

I do not say the following to boast; But honestly, I have a full time job that I work at 8 hours a day, five days a week like everyone else does. Yet I write and post daily devotional here, and I am on the worship team at church, serving on it every Sunday, for three services. We practice worship once a week for a few hours to prepare for Sunday, and I am also a co-teacher for a weekly men's bible study. Even my wife serves at church, and is the head of the woman's ministry, yet she cleans the house, makes the meals and do normal mom/wife things everyday.

And still leads a weekly woman's bible study and is part of the prayer group in church that meets once a week.

Once again, I am not bragging or boasting on myself, or my wife, but it's a wakeup call for some of you, because what it really boils down to is your priority, and it shows what your priority really is, either serving the Lord or serving your flesh, because it's one or the other.

Now my wife and I are not some super Christians, we are a normal man and woman, husband and wife, mom and dad. But I suppose the key is that we both put the Lord first in our lives and our relationship. Which means that we choose to serve the Lord. Not to earn His love or our salvation, but because He loves us and we love Him; Therefore, we don't need to come up with excuses not to serve Him and others in the church.

You too are a normal man or woman, just like everyone else that is in the church that serves. But be a normal man or woman in the church who loves the Lord, and not one who gives excuses to the Lord.

Therefore; keep the sign posted inside or out outside your house:

“But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD.”

And as you do, then may you and your family do what it says with all your heart:

“We will serve the LORD”
