Luke 9:20

He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter answered and said, "The Christ of God."

It could had been the emotion that caused you to be attracted to that person or even their outward appearance, but now that you know the real them, you are not liking what you see or are hoping that you can fix him or her.

Some people will come to Jesus based upon an emotion or thinking that He will be what they want Him to be, which could be someone who would love them, but also allow them to continue in their sinful lifestyle.

Sure, give me some of that Jesus who died for me, but Who also says it's ok to live with someone and have sex outside of marriage.

Give me some of that Jesus who is ok with me going out to clubs or drinking everyday so I can get drunk all the time.

Give me some of that Jesus that I can post scripture about, then post how much I love the Walking Dead and post bad things about others, especially those I don't even know personally like actors, actresses, politicians etc...

Give me some of that Jesus that forgave the woman caught in adultery, but don't you dare give me any of that Jesus that said, "go and sin no more" because I want Jesus and my sinful lifestyle too.

Just like in marriage, when you first marry that person, you don't really know all about him or her, but you know enough to hopefully say, that no matter what, I want to live the rest of my life with this person. And after you start to learn more and more, you realize that the honeymoon is over and reality of life with this person now becomes a reality.

People come to love the Jesus in a manger or on the cross and decide to give their life to Him. But after that honeymoon wears off, so to speak, the reality of all of Jesus comes into play and some will actually; just like in marriage say, I did not sign up for this, I'm out of here, and leave the marriage or, go back into the world living a sinful lifestyle once again.

But those who truly love the Lord will seek Him to find out more and more about Him every day, once they do they start to fall even more and more in love with Him.
