Matthew 6:10 (KJV)

Today's devotional verse is part of what many call The Lord's Prayer, and how many of us know it and can quote it word for word? We all love it and want to live by what it says.

Promans 9:20 But indeed, O man, who are you to reply against God? Will the thing formed say to him who formed it, "Why have you made me like this?"

♦ Job 26:14 Indeed these are the mere edges of His ways, and how small a whisper we hear of Him! But the thunder of His power who can understand?

Hosea 14:9 Who is wise? Let him understand these things. Who is prudent? Let him know them. For the ways of the LORD are right; The righteous walk in them, but transgressors stumble in them.
