

Matthew 6:11

Give us this day our daily bread.

As you read in Matthew chapters 5-7, this is what we call the Sermon on the Mount, which also contains the Beatitudes in chapter 5 verses 3-11. And here in the middle of that teaching in chapter 6 Jesus teaches us how to pray, commonly titled by man as “The Lord’s Prayer” and when Jesus taught on it He did not say, “Repeat this prayer over and over” but rather, ***“In this manner, therefore, pray:” Matthew 6:9a***, which is not saying to repeat it, but you can think of it as a template (*In this manner*) on structuring your prayers to God, taking each section and considering it as the title of each section, and you fill in the rest with what your heart wants to speak to God in regards to that title.

But we are not going to get into that today, but there is one part that I want us to focus on, which is today’s verse that says, ***“Give us this day our daily bread.”*** Which is a request, not a demand to God. But if you think about it, this is referring to both physical bread (food), as well as our spiritual bread, as we read of Jesus teaching us about that as well when He said in **John 4:32** ***But He said to them, “I have food to eat of which you do not know.”*** Referring to spiritual food.

But have you noticed that when you pray, ***“Give us this day our daily bread.”*** that “POOF” all of a sudden there is the food right in front of you, because you say these magic words and food appears right before your eyes?

Now some of you are laughing thinking that is ridiculous, which it is, because that’s not how it works. Rather, we are to pray for God’s provision, and then you take action with that prayer.

† **James 2:20** *But do you want to know, O foolish man, that faith without works is dead?*

Once again, you don’t pray it, then just sit there waiting for it to happen. But you simply pray ***“Give us this day our daily bread.”*** and get up, go to the frig or pantry, open the door, and there, right before your eyes is God provision. Or the Lord has provided you with money so you go to the store and buy food with His provision of money to provide for your daily bread (food).

Now you may be thinking, *“How can that be? I worked hard and made money and I bought that food.”* Which is true in a sense, but also realize that GOD gave you that job, so you can have a paycheck so you can go buy food for your family and yourself. But you can also pray, ***“Give us this day our daily bread.”*** Then take your paycheck and blow it all on alcohol, video games, clothes, cars, toys, phones, computers, tablets... and then you will think, *“I prayed ‘Give us this day our daily bread.’ and I don’t have any, so God did not answer my prayer.”* Which is 100% wrong, because God did provide for your daily bread, you just used that money foolishly.

But the same is true when you pray, ***“Give us this day our daily bread.”*** in regards to spiritual food. So you pray that and just sit there, waiting for God to give you some sort of revelation, or to send an angel to speak to you, but you hear nothing at all. Well, just like our example of

physical food, where you go to the pantry or frig to get that food, so it is with spiritual food. Just think of it this way, your bible is your spiritual frig or pantry; Therefore, you have to get up and go get your bible, open it up (Like opening the door to your frig or pantry) and partake of the goodness of God's word.
