## Philippians 1:23

For I am hard pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better.

God did not allow you to wake up today so that you could do or say something stupid. But rather so that you would bring glory to His name!

When I woke up this morning, I decided that I would sin 384 times before lunch today, which would include robbing a bank, killing a stranger, getting drunk and causing an accident, walk into an elementary school and yell out profanities, cussing my brains out, and getting into a fight and.....

Ok, not really, but if you think about it, how many of us wake up and think, "What sins can I commit today?" Hopefully no one. Yet how many may not think of things as sin, but plan on sinning anyway?

- ➤ How many will plan on going out and partying today or tonight or this weekend?
- ➤ How many have on their shopping list with cases of beer or bottles of alcohol that they plan on buying that day?
- ➤ How many plan to go see that "R" rated movie that they know is full of sex and nudity and profanity?
- ➤ How many know they should tithe on the paycheck they just got, but decided that they wanted to get that one thing, or go to that one place; therefore, they decide not to tithe?
- ➤ How many can't wait to go to Vegas this weekend, because they know what happens in Vegas, stays in Vegas.

Shall I go on? I didn't think so.

Let's read today's verse again in it's context from the NLT:

Philippians 1:21-24 (NLT2) For to me, living means living for Christ, and dying is even better. But if I live, I can do more fruitful work for Christ. So I really don't know which is better. I'm torn between two desires: I long to go and be with Christ, which would be far better for me. But for your sakes, it is better that I continue to live.

Paul was battling with staying here on this earth to be a witness for Jesus Christ, verses, going home to heaven to be with Jesus Christ. I know for me, my greatest desire is to be in heaven right now with my Savior, Jesus Christ. But every day the Lord awakens me to a brand-new day here on this earth, and that's where my initial thought comes into play, which is: **God did not allow you to wake up today so that you could do or say something stupid. But rather so that you would bring glory to His name!** 

Some of us struggle to be with the Lord in heaven like Paul was, verses staying here on the earth being a witness for the Lord. Whereas others struggle every day with living as a Christian, verses living as a non believer.

Paul also says that "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not helpful. All things are lawful for me, but I will not be brought under the power of any." 1 Corinthians 6:12

We as Christians are free to do whatever we want. But as Paul says that even though we are, that "all things are not helpful."

So, think of the things you are planning on doing today or this weekend, and ask yourself if you are being "brought under the power of any" of them, meaning are they controlling you, and even though you are not saying that they are sin, do you know that they really are, yet you're planning on doing them anyway?
