Proverbs 4:26

Ponder the path of your feet, And let all your ways be established.

"Well, I don't like the way He provided, I want to get to heaven my own way" you may be thinking. So, you are telling me that you want to reject Jesus and God's perfect plan of redemption, "In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace."
