Revelation 1:8

"I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."

Wow, what an awesome verse to start the weekend off with. But the question is, do you really believe it? You say yes, "I believe that the Lord is 'the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End" Great, so do I, but if we truly believe that, then why don't we trust Him for the middle, the in between, the here and now? You know, the space between Alpha _ Omega.

We know that eternity is forever, and if God is the Alpha (Beginning) and He created all things and always has been, even before time, even before the earth and the moon and stars and everything we see existed.

Job 38:4 Where were you when I laid the foundations of the earth? Tell Me, if you have understanding.

Plus, He is the Omega (the End) but has no ending. And to help us understand that, let me give you the following example.

Say you were to take an ant and put it outside on the ground and watch it walk away. And this ant would walk all the way around the earth, back to the point where you put it down on the ground. Are you not of more value than they?" Matthew 6:25-26

I think so; therefore, we won't truly understand eternity until we are in heaven and see the Author of eternity.

Today's devotional is a rather short one, but with this being such a short devotional, may it remind us that our time here is very short, yet we have eternity to spend with the Lord. So if we trust Him for our eternity, let's start trusting Him for our short time here on the earth as well.
