That is what God has done for us. He has given us life the day we were born, and we take this life and run it into the mud, dirt, and places it shouldn't be. Now God is saying that it is time for Him to take it back so that He can clean it up for us. Why? Because God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
